SWAMIJI

सर्ववेदान्तसिद्धान्तगोचरं तमगोचरम्। गोविन्दं परमानन्दं सद्गुरुं प्रग्तोऽस्म्यहम्।।

1. First of all, my love and regard to the Great Teacher Govinda, who is blissful by nature and whose personality is accessible only to that seeker who is equipped with the uniqueness of Vedantic insight.

दुर्लभं त्रयमेवैतदैवानुग्रहहेतुकम् । मनुष्यत्वं मुमुक्षुत्व महापुरुषसंश्रयः ॥

2. These three are indeed rare in the world: to be born a noble human, to be fired with the spirit of seeking and to live under the nourishing care of a magnificent benevolent Sage.

श्रदामिक्तिहर्यानयोगान्मुमुक्षो— मृक्ते हेंतू विक्ति साक्षाच्छु तेगीः । यो वा एतेष्वेव तिष्ठत्यमुख्य मोक्षोऽविद्याकित्यताहेहबन्यात् ॥

3. The Scriptures have emphasized earnestness of purpose, piety and humility, together
with the practice of meditation, as the factors
leading the secker to the ideal of liberation. For
the one betaking himself exclusively to these is
alone ordained liberation from the irksome shackles of bondage wrought by ignorance.

विशुद्धसत्त्वस्य गुगाः प्रसादः
स्वात्मानुभूतिः परमा प्रशान्तिः ।
तृष्तिः प्रहर्षः परमात्मनिष्ठा
यया सदानन्दरसं समृच्छति ।।

4. The features of pure sattwa are (1) cheerfulness of disposition (2) the direct experience of the Self (3) supreme quietness (4) contentment at heart (5) delightfulness and (6) the inmost subtle discipline arising out of Self-realization, by dint of which one derives the taste of continual bliss.

भनेव सत्वात्मिनि घीगुहाया

मध्याकृताकाश उश्चरप्रकाश:।

श्राकाश उच्चैः रिवनत्प्रकाशते

स्वतेजसा विश्वमिदं प्रकाशयन्।।

5. In this body itself, in the being filled with sattwa, in the cavity of intelligence in the aakaasa described as the unmanifested, shines the brilliance called the Self, like the luminous sun aloft in the external sky, bringing by virtue of its own unborrowed splendour this extensive universe into cognition.

न जायते नो म्प्रियते न वर्धते

न क्षीयते नो विकरोति नित्यः ।

विलीयमानेऽपि वपुष्यमुष्मि—

न लीयते कुम्भ इवाम्बरं स्वयम् ।।

6. Neither getting born nor dying, it (the Self) does not grow or decline; remaining eternal, it does not change the least. When this body falls and disintegrates itself, it does not get involved in the fate, as it is with the sky held in by the objects. Its independence is absolute at all times.

जाग्रत्स्वप्नसुषुप्तिषु स्फुटतरं योऽसौ समुज्जृम्भते प्रत्यग्र्पतया सदाहमहमित्यन्तः स्फुरन्नैकधा । नानाकारिवकारमागिन इमान् पश्यन्नहं धीमुखान् नित्यानन्दि चिदात्मना स्फुरित तं विद्धि स्वमेतं हृदि ।।

7. Know thou that Self in your own heart, shining always in the form of pure existence, knowledge and bliss, manifesting clearly in the wakeful, dream and deep sleep states alike in the form of an inward entity, giving rise to the notion 'I', which persists uniformly, witnessing the several changes and modifications taking place around the central ego. Know surely this constant entity abiding in your own heart.

शान्तो दान्तः परमुपरतः क्षान्तियुक्तः समाधिम् कुर्वे ज्ञित्यं कलयति यतिः स्वस्य सर्वात्ममावम् । तेनाविद्यातिमिरजनितान्साधु दग्ध्वा विकल्पान् ब्रह्माकृत्या निवसति सुखं निष्क्रियो निर्विकल्पः ॥

8. Quiet, restrained, devoted fully to the practice of inner withdrawal, filled with tolerance, practising samadhi (Self-perception), the ascetic contemplates constantly upon the universal nature and magnitude of his Self. By burning off wholesomely all the distracting thoughts caused by the darkness of ignorance, nescience, he remains in the Brahmic blissful state, freed easily from the clutches of karma and the resultant internal oscillations.

निविकल्पकसमाधिना स्फुटम् ब्रह्मनत्त्वमवंगम्यते ध्रुवम् । नान्यथा चलतया मनोगते: प्रत्ययान्तरविमिधितं भवेत् ॥

9. By nirvikalpa Samadhi alone is the truth of Brahman realized with clarity and firmness. Not otherwise For, if the mind is the least allowed to function, the process will involve vibration and movement and then the awareness instantly gets mixed up with other ideas and apprehensions.

साधुभिः पूज्यमानैऽस्मिन् पीड्यमानेऽपि दुर्जनै:। सममावो भवेद्यस्य स जीवन्मुक्तलक्षराः।।

10. It is indeed a characteristic of the Jeevanmukta to be given to a natural equalness of response, when worshipped by the good or tormented by the wicked.

न खिद्यते नो विषयै: प्रमोदते न सज्जते नापि विरज्यते च । स्वस्मिन्सदा क्रीडित नन्दित स्वयं निरन्तरानन्दरसेन तृष्तः ।।

11. That self-restrained person, be he a sanyasin or not, in whom the objects bestowed upon in one way or another by others find their natural dissolution and oneness, and hence are not able to arouse any agitation or distraction, is indeed one liberated in this very life.

प्रारब्धकमंपरिकल्पितवासनाभिः

संसारिवच्चरित भुक्तिषु मुक्तदेहः। सिद्धः स्वयं वसित साक्षिवदत्र तूष्णीम् चक्रस्य मूलिमव कल्पविकल्पशून्यः॥

12. Propelled by the relevant quantum of prenatal influences, the Knower rambles amidst the objects, as would an ordinary man of the world, but effortlessly, liberated as he is from the binding body-idea. Like the pivot of the potter's wheel, he lives unaffectedly in the body, remaining ever the witness, undisturbed by the mind's oscillations.
